Always inventive and interesting, pammyj100 (I call her The Queen) has an eye for vignettes and scenes. She is a muse for using a different or even common song to illustrate her scenes. I always see things I've never seen before – can you count how many surprises there were for you? About 50 to 70 seconds in she wedges in a facsimile of her house as well as her catering business. The video composition and village construction are always topnotch. Again, you can check all the boxes for excellence. His first scene shows a videography gift of how to shoot with a moving camera and maintain steadiness. He shows that it takes a lot of work to make a village look good. Aside from his over-the-top construction, he tells us in the YouTube Description section, "It has been filmed entirely with an iPhone 7 then edited in Final Cut Pro. About 3 - 4 hours of filming work yields roughly 50 to 60 seconds of usable video."

This was their third video, and here they became different and innovative! Their use of captions for neighborhoods and individual buildings is fun to watch and helps us focus on details with their use of zoom. I believe they've been watching mogas98 and borrowed his use of captions and neighborhoods, but who would know? They hide their non-16x9 black bars well, but why not just turn the camera sideways or adjust the aspect ratio to 16x9?

Here is a relatively small, linear village of Lemax faćades shot with short video clips and still photos. The vignettes and videography are so well done! I asked in the comments how his lighting and composition was done, he responded, "The entire video was shot with an iPhone 8 in 4K on a tripod. The video was done in Final Cut Pro. As far as lighting, the facade displays are all under artwork. We simply removed the paintings and used the picture lighting as extra illumination."
